## About Us

Daffodil Ministries facilitates safe, sustainable housing, supportive relationships, and connections to local resources to survivors of domestic abuse in our community.

When fleeing an abusive relationship, many women escape with only their children and the clothes on their back.

Daffodil helps facilitate safe housing and a fresh start for survivors of domestic violence.

## The Need is Great

One in three women in the US have experienced some form of physical violence by an intimate partner. Leaving an abuser often leads to homelessness and tremendous challenges due to compromised credit, a marginal rental history, sporadic employment, child care needs, lack of dependable transportation, and the impact on mental health.

Many find a temporary safe place such as Safe Haven or the YWCA. But those shelters typically have a 60 day maximum stay, with limited assistance following discharge. Some women have no choice but to go back to their abuser, or to couch-surf with whomever will put them up, or to live in their car.

Since starting ministry in 2019, Daffodil has received more than 100 referrals from Safe Haven and similar organizations, with the number growing significantly each year. Daffodil has helped many of these women—usually with young children—to secure safe, long-term housing, while also providing household items and other support.

## A Place to Call Home



It is difficult to find landlords willing to rent to women coming out of difficult situations. While continuing to help clients get into permanent housing, Daffodil Ministries would like to address the lack of affordable housing. As a first step, in August of 2022, a friend of Daffodil Ministries purchased a duplex and then allowed us to renovate it and use it for ministry while we worked to raise money to pay him back.

Incredibly, many local businesses donated over \$60,000 worth of materials and services, and volunteers put in more than 2,000 hours renovating the duplex. Now we have a beautiful, welcoming space that families can call home.

Over the next year we need to raise additional funds to complete the purchase of the duplex.
